Dear Members and Friends of Hope Community Presbyterian Church,

It has been my privilege to be the pastor at Hope Community Presbyterian Church since June of 2022. It has been my joy to lead worship, preach, provide pastoral care, visit in hospitals, care centers, assisted living centers and homes, moderate Session meetings, attend Deacon, Support and Worship committee meetings, participate in Food for Thought, administer Communion, conduct baptisms, officiate at Celebration of Life and Graveside funeral services, lead a Bible Study, attend Presbytery gatherings, sing with the choir, develop messages for young disciples, write monthly newsletter articles, fill the little pantry, volunteer at Ruby's pantry monthly to help fill the little pantry, assist in developing services to celebrate special liturgical events like our hundredth anniversary celebration and Christmas eve, enjoy Lenten soup suppers, and most especially, to spend time with each of you. You have enriched my life; I am grateful for each of you; Your kindness and encouragement has been very meaningful to me.

As you may know, for the past several months I have been struggling with what seems to be a psychological as well as a physiological depression. Because I have been advised by medical mental health professionals to take some time to obtain the therapy needed to heal, I will not be renewing my annual contract with Hope Community Presbyterian Church. In fact, I will be terminating my current contract early and not be leading worship or preaching during the months of May or June. Each morning, I seek God's will for my day and for my life by reading Scripture. The two scripture passages I read this morning included:

Isaiah 48:17 that says, "This is what the LORD says – your Redeemer, the Holy One of Israel: "I am the LORD your god, who teaches you what is best for you, who directs you in the way you should go."

and

Psalm 46:10 that says, "Be still, and know that I am God; I will be exalted among the nations, I will be exalted in the earth."

I am not planning on leaving Virginia or the Range, so, when I am feeling better, I will be available to provide Pulpit Supply at Hope Community Presbyterian Church when it is needed.
